To better explain Section 552.110, when a third-party (BT) has marked information as confidential or proprietary, the Texas Public Information Act states that the City of Amarillo is not in a position to determine if the information is truly confidential or proprietary. Therefore, we write a letter to the Attorney General and ask them to opine on if the information should be released. When we send this letter to the AG under 552.110, we also send notice to the third-party whose information is being requested letting them know how they may reach out to the AG's office and make their case as to why they believe their information may be withheld. As soon as we receive the opinion back from the AG's office, we release information or withhold it, based upon that ruling. Even if information cannot be released, we share a copy of the AG's opinion with the requestor and third-party.
